Recent Events

Stewart Springs Run – It was another beautiful North State day on Tues, 6/16 when a group of BC enthusiasts met in the MacDonalds parking lot in Shasta Lake City. There were 2 TR's, an MGB and 2 daily drivers at 9:00 and we headed north shortly thereafter. About 45 miles up I-5, Bob Harris's TR-6 suddenly shut down. We stopped to offer assistance and Bob soon discovered a vacuum hose which was part of the smog control system

had come loose. He reconnected it and the car started. He decided to head back for home and the rest of us continued on to a pit stop in Weed. After that stop, we continued north to the Gazzelle exit where we turned west and then left again onto Stewart Springs Rd and then right on Park Creek Rd. It was barely a two land road that wound it's way up into the mountains. It was a great drive which was thankfully devoid of traffic as it

was often only one lane wide. We stopped at the summit for lunch and were met by Rex Murphy who had come up from Weaverville, but decided it was too windy & cold, so we continued on down the other side in search of a warm spot. After lunch, we continued on down where we connected up with highway 3 to Weaverville and back into Redding. A total of about 150 miles of beautiful scenery.

Red Gate Ranch Run – It was hot on Wed, 6/24 at 10:30 in the morning, already 90 degrees in the Holiday Market parking lot at Placer Drive and



Buenaventura. We had 4 British cars in the form of a Spitfire, TR-4, TR-6 and a Mini along with my daily driver. We headed out by driving west on Placer which unbeknownst to me goes all the way to Igo and beyond. It's a beautiful sports car road with lots of twisty turneys and ups & downs. At Clear Creek Rd, it becomes Gas Point Rd and goes past the Northern California Veterans Cemetery and on into Cottonwood where we met up



We had our usual picnic lunch as we waited for them to set up their "store" so we could take advantage of their organic farming efforts.

It's Not Just a Miniature Tow Truck, It's a Mini

Meet a California couple with an obsession: turning the tiny British cars into unique creations

Norm and Jesse Nelson's Tiny Tows 1962 Austin Mini. The Nelsons have built everything from a rolling Chiquita banana tribute mobile to a cop car, all out of vintage Minis. Max Whittaker for The Wall Street Journal By A.J. Baime

Norm Nelson: I have always loved British cars and I worked on them and raced them when I was young. In particular I've always loved vintage Minis. I am lucky that my wife is as crazy about them as I am. Minis were built in Britain starting in 1959. The car was imagined in response to rising fuel prices to be a small, economic vehicle that could hold four people. It quickly became a cultural icon. A number of brands were associated with Minis. You had Austin Minis and Morris Minis. There were higher-performance Mini Coopers. [Today's Mini brand is owned by <u>BMW</u>.]

Jesse Nelson: When we became empty-nesters, Norm told me I should get a new car, something sporty. I test-drove a few and didn't like them. I went on the internet one night in 2006 and found this beat-up old car and I had a vision for it. I woke Norm at 3 a.m. and said, "I just bought a 1973 Mini Cooper." It was in terrible shape and when he looked at it, he said, "What have you done?" I said, "I have a vision." He said, "You could be hospitalized for those."

Norm: What we do is we find a car, we look at it, share it with our Mini club and we ask people, "What do you think would be a good idea for this one?"

Jesse: I look at it differently. We find these vintage Minis and they tell us what they want to be when they grow up. They all have names. That is sort of a Mini thing. Mini enthusiasts like to name their cars.

Jesse: Tiny Tows is one of our most popular creations. It took us a year and it is a tow truck built out of a 1962 Austin Mini pickup. It is a tribute to our tow truck drivers, who never get any recognition. They do a really important job and a dangerous job, so we built Tiny Tows in honor of them. Adults love it. Kids love it. I once drove Tiny Tows home from Las Vegas, over 600 miles, in one day. We drive the heck out of all these cars.

Norm: Our next car will be an Ecto-1 Ghostbusters car. It is going to look exactly like the car in the movie, only it'll be a Mini, naturally.
